OBITUARY

ARLEANA BRANCH COLLINS was born in Buffalo, New York on November 19, 1926, one of four children of Mrs. Linnie Duff Branch and the Late William A. Branch. On September 5, 1947, Arleana Branch Collins and Donald Frederick Collins were wed and to this union were born three children - twins, Donna and Donald, and a second son, Steven Craig.

Arleana was a graduate of Public School 47, Hutchinson-Central High School, and attended Erie County Technical Institute for two years. For the past twenty-three years, she was an employee of the E.J. Meyer Memorial Hospital of Erie County, and at the time of her passing, she had advanced to the paraprofessional level of Mental Health Technician **II** (Team One), Meyer Hospital.

Arleana joined Bethel A.M.E. Church at a tender age and received her early Christian training in the Church School along with her brothers and sisters. This intensive Christian development resulted in a deep religious conviction and her continuing abiding faith in the Lord. In 1963, when Arleana was appointed as a member of Stewardess Board No. 2, she realized a lifelong dream, that of serving on the Board of which her mother was a charter member. In recent years, she was privileged to serve as President of Board No. 2, a post she still held at the time of her demise. Arleana also was also a faithful member and Financial Secretary of the Sisters of Jeremiah #130, ORDER OF EASTERN STAR. She was a member of Local 1094, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO.

Left to mourn her passing are her devoted Husband, Donald F., Sr.; three children, Mrs. Donna (Earle) Anderson, Donald F., Jr., and Steven Craig Collins; one granddaughter, Alicia Carol Collins; her beautiful mother, Mrs. Linnie Branch, her only sister, Mildred, two brothers, William L., and Frank E. Branch; son-in-law, Earle Anderson; daughter-in-law, Carrie Collins.
