

## OBITUARY

For it has been the will of Our Heavenly Father, to call unto eternal rest, Alfred Johnson of Buffalo, New York on the ninetieth day of April, 1981 at 9:45 p.m. at Sheehan Memorial Emergency Hospital. Alfred Johnson, son of the late Albert Johnson and the late Hattie Johnson was born July 30, 1904 in Levi, South Carolina.
