Rev. Janie Belle (Tucker) Hampton was born December 11, 1916 to Johnnie and Eliza Hill Greene of Calhoun Falls, South Carolina. She was the 14th child of 14. She departed this life suddenly, Monday, November 26th, 1990 in Greenwood, South Carolina. Rev. Tucker attended grade school in Calhoun Falls and High School in Ashville, North Carolina. She was an active member of Glover's A.M.E. Church in Calhoun Falls, S.C.

Janie came to Buffalo, New York in 1940, joined Bethel A.M.E. Church, 551 E. Eagle Street, under the pastorate of Rev. William McKinley Dawkins. She became active in the Sunday School, was a charter member of the Bethel A.M.E. Federal Credit Union, serving as Secretary for 15 years. She was a member of the H.P. Anderson Club, The Evening Choir, Stewardess Board #2 and the Missionary Society.

Her favorite scripture was the 23rd Psalms and her favorite hymn was "I Am Thine O Lord."

Rev. Janie Tucker was united in Holy Matrimony to Wardell Tucker in 1943 and to this union 2 sons were born — John David and Wardell, Jr. Mr. Tucker preceded her in death.

Rev. Janie Tucker was ordained as Minister under Rev. Harry J. White, Sr.

In 1978 she was united in marriage to Rev. R.H. Hampton and moved to McCormick, South Carolina.

Randolph Hampton, 2 sons: John David (Paulette E.) and Wardell, Jr.; one granddaughter: Tonya Evette; 3 stepsons: Solomon Hampton of McCormick S.C., George & Edwin Hampton of Augusta Ga.; 3 sisters: Minnie Little of Plainsfield, New Jersey, Willa Johnson and Mattie Adams of Buffalo, New York, innumerable relatives, nieces, nephews, cousins and a host of friends.
