

Glowver David Knight was born January 16, 1913 in Thomasville, Georgia, the city of Roses, to David and Bessie Knight. He died Friday, November 25, 1994 in Sisters of Charity Hospital.

The Knight family moved to Buffalo, New York in 1916, where Glowver attended Buffalo public schools 32, 47, 31 and he graduated from Masten High School.

A faithful member of Bethel A.M.E. Church since 1918, he was active with the Usher Board.

Glowver served in the United States Army from 1943-1946 and was stationed in England and Scotland. He had been employed at the Standard Oil Company, Buffalo Arms, Ford Motor Company and the United States Post Office from where he retired in 1977 after 40 years of employment. For 10 years he served as President of the Postal Alliance/National Organization of Postal Employees.

Active in the community, Glowver volunteered with the City of Buffalo's Neighborhood Revitalization — Salary Review Committee, Board of Directors at the Jesse Nash Health Center, Board of Directors at the Erie County Water Authority, and a founding member of the Citizens Community Development Corporation. He also was a member of the Appomattox Club, Ellicott Neighborhood Advisory Committee, AMVETS, NAACP, and the Moot Senior Citizens Center, from which he received an award this month.

Glowver enjoyed traveling and had visited all 50 states, and was an avid pinochle player.

Glowver leaves to cherish his memory; a sister: Francis K. Hall; two nephews: Thomas B. (Mary) Hall and Glowver D. (Rose) Hall; one great-nephew: Miles Langston Hall; one great-niece: Allegra Bess Hall; many cousins and friends.
