
Visual Design

- -We reduced the colors to oranges and blues, colors that are completementary, and that are happier in comparison to the red, black, and navy shades that were on display on their old website.




Typeface Choice





Create and Manage Pages

Utilizing the Wordpress Dashboard, users can easily and efficiently create pages, subpages, and post on pages. By selecting the "pages" tab, users are shown access to all pages on the site. Users are also able to add new pages, edit current pages, and delete pages. While working on a page, users are able to preview changes, before updating the page for the public to see. Pages are capable of numerous stylistic choices. Wordpress capabilities allow for choices including: bold type italic type, bulleted lists, YouTube linked videos, which Joyful Rescues often post on their channel, and photographs of animals. After publishing a page, Wordpress creates pages by automatically linking them to the navigation bar. If a user wishes to create the new page to appear as a section within a main heading, they must be sure to set the parent of the new page to the heading they want it to appear under.

Generate Blog Posts

Utilizing the "Posts" tab, users are able to generate content that will update any of the pages, such as the welcome page, the home page, and the about us page, just to mention a few. This means publicizing information is an easy and user friendly experience. An image, link to another content or additional forms, among others, can be created within a single post. As Joyful Rescues updates their wesbite, and wishes to add more, posts can be created efficiently and effectively. Posts can also be tagged with specific keywords, which make the content found within the post more searchable and findable.




Deploy Phase:

Use Contact Form 7

The contact form, located in the "Contact Us" page found in the navigation bar, as the last tab is currently used to contact the rescue via email. Utilizing the Wordpress plugin "Contact Form 7" users will be able to update the contact form however they deem fit. Simply open the plugin, and follow the example given. Several changes can be made here, such as typeface, color change, and redirecting feedback to another user.

Add Images of Adoptable Dogs & Cats

Utilizing the gallery plugin, users are able to add more images to the gallery, for example, adding more images of cats or dogs that are available for adoption. Simply edit a gallery, upload an image, and add text about the animal to the page. Text is currently organized as: Name of dog or cat, followed by breed, age, and a brief summary of the animal. A continuation of information in this format should be used in order to maintain consistancy on the wesbite. Once completed, the new cat or dog will appear within the gallery.



Change Site Layout

The layout of the site is determined by PHP files that are uploaded remotely to a server. Once on the server, the files become difficult to alter and modifications to the layout should not be necessary. The site is designed to be responsive and has a strong hierarchy which allows the viewer to quickly find the information they are looking for. The site was made to fit a particular aesthetic, which is branded with Joyful Rescues.

Change Color Scheme

The color scheme has been chosen specifically to complement the new logo that was created for Joyful Rescues. When the new logo was created, Joyful Rescues was re-branded. Hues were derived from the new logo, and work well to balance the site as a whole. Should the color scheme need to be changed one day, a web designer must recode for the necessary adjustments. If color scheme was to be changed, the buttons on the home page, social media buttons, logo, and donate button would also have to be changed to fit the new color scheme. It should be noted that through Wordpress, an admin can adjust the colors of the navigation bar through the widget, however such action should not be taken unless otherwise stated.




Main Screen (WordPress)

The menu lists options such as pages, where the client is welcome to add pages to their website, posts, where the client is welcome to add posts about upcoming events, among various other important tools.


In the Deploy Phases, we spoke of the user's ability to be able to create and manage pages. The user is able to do this by clicking on the pages












