

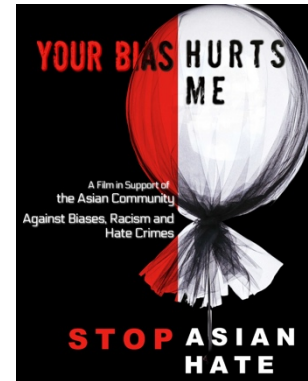
"Your Bias Hurts Me": Stop Asian Hate

WHAT YOU DO

1. For Asian participants

Please choose one statement from the scripts below, or alike:

1. "I am Chinese. We don't eat bats. We love animals."
2. "I am a Chinese international student. We are not spies. We come to America to study and make the world a better place."
3. "I am Chinese. It's not called the China Virus. It's COVID-19."
4. "I am Japanese. Don't call me Sushi. Don't play with my name. I am xxx (your name)."
5. "I am (your ethnicity). I am not silent. I speak up."
6. "I am (your ethnicity). My ethnicity is not a virus. Hate is. Fight the virus, not me."
7. "I am (your ethnicity). Show me respect, not violence."
8. "I am (your ethnicity). My accent does not matter. My voice does."
9. "I am (your ethnicity). I am not a minority; I have been minoritized."

OR

Asian participants don't need to choose any of the statements, but just say the slogan:

"Proud to be Asian."

"Your bias hurts me. Stop (your ethnicity) Hate. Stop Asian Hate."

2. For non-Asian participants

Please choose the following statement, or alike, to support the Asian community.

"I stand with my Asian friends. Your bias hurts them. Stop Asian Hate."
