

Jamie M. Ostrov is a Professor of Psychology in the Clinical Psychology program at the University at Buffalo, The State University of New York. Dr. Ostrov is also the Director of the Social Development Laboratory and the Director of the Advanced Certificate in Developmental Science program at the University at Buffalo. As a developmental psychologist, Dr. Ostrov's research focuses on understanding the development of subtypes of aggression and peer victimization in young children. Current projects examine the important transition from preschool to kindergarten and include assessments of psychophysiology as key developmental mechanisms underlying the school readiness process.

Dr. Ostrov has published his research in a variety of top peer-reviewed journals including: *Child Development*, *Development & Psychopathology*, and *Psychological Review*. Dr. Ostrov currently serves on 7 editorial boards including: *Aggressive Behavior*, *Child Development*, *Journal of Applied Developmental Psychology*, *Journal of Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology*, and *Social Development*.

His research is currently funded by the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD) and the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA). His recent research has also been funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF).

Dr. Ostrov obtained his M.A. and Ph.D. in Child (Developmental) Psychology from the University of Minnesota. He received an M.S.E.d. in Psychological Services from the University of Pennsylvania and completed his B.A. in Psychology (Summa Cum Laude) at Colgate University.
