Presently the BFWC is comprised of 25 Clubs (of which UBWC is one of those Club) So that means that all members belonging to each of these 25 Clubs are automatically members of the Buffalo Federation. *In essence ALL members of UB Women's Club belong to the Buffalo Federation of Women's Clubs*.
