

REMEMBER TO FLIP YOUR BALLOT

This November 5 when you go to vote it is very important that you flip over your ballot to the back side and vote **YES** for **PROPOSITION 1**. New Yorkers deserve the freedom to control our own bodies, lives, and futures. Even here in New York, out of touch politicians have introduced 53 anti-abortion and anti-reproductive rights bills in the last decade. New York's current laws can be changed or rolled back depending on who is in the state legislature or in the Governor's Mansion. Prop 1 closes loopholes in the state constitution so New Yorkers, no matter who we are, can never be discriminated against by the government. This proposition will be the first in the country to have such a comprehensive amendment.
