80th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

MILESTONE: An important event, a turning point; an event or accomplishment marking a significant advance in an endeavor; a notable achievement.

The UB Women's Club marks a milestone on May 1, 2026; the 80th anniversary of the founding of the organization. In the months leading up to this momentous achievement, the UB Women's Club will have a series of special events. But how did the Women's Club get to this point?

The origins stem from the Newcomers' Club begun in 1939. Suggested by Jessie Puffer (wife of Claude Puffer who became acting Chancellor of the University of Buffalo 1955-57), some current faculty wives gave a party and invited faculty wives who were new to the university. As this new group grew in membership it was decided to create a new all-university Women's Club in 1945. That group was called the "University of Buffalo Faculty Women's Club." On May 1, 1946 the group adopted its constitution and bylaws and elected a slate of officers. It officially became "The Women's Club of the University of Buffalo." The first elected president was Elizabeth Ten Eyck Perry and Grace Capen the first honorary president. Grace was the wife of Samuel Capen, the first full time Chancellor of the University of Buffalo serving from 1922-1950. The University of Buffalo began as a private medical college in 1846 until it merged with the State University of New York system in 1962 becoming a public research university and changing its name to the University at Buffalo.

In the first four decades the Women's Club grew in numbers and scope. What began as a way for women new to the university community and/or Buffalo to make friends now was a service organization providing scholarships, financial aid awards, service to the university community, and assisting international students by providing social gatherings and English language "conversation groups." The Club began as a newcomers' group but quickly added interest or activity groups which numbered 22 at one point; everything from art appreciation to UB walkers. Our Grace Capen Academic Award was established in 1975 to recognize academic achievement. This is a non-competitive scholarship; awarded to students meeting the eligibility and academic criteria. To honor Grace Capen, the Club began a "Grace W. Capen Loan Fund" in 1950 which eventually became the basis for the Grace Capen Financial Aid Awards.

The UB Women's Club means something different to each of us, whether it be a second family to those of us from other parts of the country or a place to expand our horizons and experiences with like-minded women. The first 80 years have been exceptional holding the promise that the next 80 years will be just as remarkable. Please join with the 80th anniversary committee as we Celebrate 80!
